Wildland Urban Interface Code – County Resolution 2022-003. BJ updated the board regarding the issues resulting from the new county code.

House Bill 23-1023 Construction Bids – Effective 08/04/023 the need to accept construction bids has been raised to \$120,00.00. Viki will contact Eric regarding the ability of the board to perform the work themselves if they can do it for less than the lowest bid.

Easter Event – The water board has requested \$109.00 to help with the Easter Egg Hunt and picnic which was held April 8th. Doug Harris made a motion to **APPROVE** the funding. Second by Matthew Younger. No further discussion approved by majority.

QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS: The fire up at the West Elk Mine is heating back up. Colorado State Fire, State Forest Service, DMEA and West Elk are working on solutions for Fire control. They are asking to cut a line across Bill's rock on Doug's property, thin the timber, and cut the vegetation around the power poles. The mine is in favor of the project, DMEA is on the fence. If the power is lost to the mine, they will be unable to get the miners out. Colorado State Fire is concerned that if it goes up it will burn across the ridge all the way to Paonia. Funding is not yet secured but in all likelihood the project will happen.

The state is trying to pass a bill to establish a board that will set the Wildland Urban Interface Code statewide. The bill has not passed yet, nor has funding been set in the Long Bill.
